Speaking during the signing of the MoU, the Head of the German Technical Advisory Group said, he would like to see Julius Berger take the lead as an industry representative in the introduction of modern greener automotives and in setting the pace manpower development in that area. According to Col. Abel, the evolving nature of technology requires proactiveness and that his organisation is looking forward to higher scale partnership between AFEME and Julius Berger in the introduction of modern greener technologies and the development of the required manpower.
